Did you know that reading for pleasure can improve health and wellbeing, aid communication skills, enhance concentration, build selfesteem and improve the ability to understand one's own and others' feelings? Regular reading has even been associated with better sleeping patterns!

As you know, we are very passionate about reading at Thorpe Hesley Primary School. We have spent a great deal of time (and budget!) to research and buy core reading texts for your children to enjoy at home known in school as 'Reading Spines'. These will once again be coming home with your children from next week (F2-Y6). We ask that you spend some time discussing these texts with your children and share your reading experiences together. We know that, as busy parents, there are many jobs that need to be done but finding the time to relax and share a book with your child can be such a special time. Please remember to record any home reading in your child's school planner. We ask that you read with or listen to your child read three times a week, as a minimum!



PLEASE NOTE that we are a nut free school.

We are holding a Re-launch of TT Rockstars on Friday 14th October 2022. TT Rockstars is an online app that encourages children to practice their Times Tables regularly. As a school children from Year 2 upwards are encouraged to use it and we have seen the fact that it means our children have multiplication facts at their fingertips have a huge impact on maths progress and attainment.
