
Next week the menu is week three.

Is your child attending school every day possible......
Good attendance at school is not just valuable, it's essential.

Attendance and punctuality are vital to a child's success at school. Good attendance helps to establish positive relationships and life habits that are necessary for future success.

Attendance should not be underestimated. Even one day of education missed can have an effect on learning:

- 98% attendance means 4 school days missed
- 95% attendance means 10 school days missed
- 80% attendance means 38 school days missed
- Five minutes late each day means 3 school days missed

Please ensure that your child attends school every day and on time.
