### This term we will be learning...

Area of learning	Objectives to be covered
Communication and Language	<ul> <li>Enjoy listening to longer stories and can remember much of what happens.</li> <li>Can find it difficult to pay attention to more than one thing at a time.</li> <li>Understand a question or instruction that has two parts, such as "Get your coat and wait at the door".</li> </ul>
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	<ul> <li>Select and use activities and resources, with help when needed. This helps them to achieve a goal they have chosen, or one which is suggested to them.</li> <li>Show more confidence in new social situations.</li> </ul>
Physical Development	<ul> <li>Continue to develop their movement, balancing, riding (scooters, trikes and bikes) and ball skills.</li> <li>Use large-muscle movements to wave flags and streamer, paint and make marks.</li> <li>Go up steps and stairs, or climb up apparatus, using alternate feet.</li> <li>Start eating independently and learning how to use a knife and fork.</li> <li>Use large and small motor skills to do things independently, for example manage buttons and zips, and pour drinks.</li> </ul>
Literacy	<ul> <li>Ask questions about the book.</li> <li>Notice some print, such as the first letter of their name, a bus or door number, or a familiar logo.</li> </ul>
Maths	<ul> <li>React to changes of amount in a group of up to three items.</li> <li>Build with a range of resources.</li> <li>Recite numbers past 5</li> <li>Say one number for each item in order 1,2,3,4,5</li> <li>Compare sizes, weights etc. using gesture and language - 'bigger/little/smaller', 'high/low', 'tall', 'heavy'.</li> <li>Notice patterns and arrange things in patterns.</li> </ul>
Understanding the World	<ul> <li>Make connections between the features of their family and other families.</li> <li>Notice differences between people</li> <li>Begin to make sense of their own life-story and family's history.</li> <li>Use all their senses in hands-on exploration of natural materials.</li> <li>Explore collections of materials with similar and/or different properties.</li> </ul>
Expressive Arts and Design	<ul> <li>Express ideas and feelings through making marks, and sometimes give a meaning to the marks they make.</li> <li>Enjoy and take part in action songs, such as 'Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star'.</li> <li>Start to develop pretend play, pretending that one object represents another. For example, a child holds a wooden block to her ear and pretends it's a phone.</li> <li>Explore different materials, using all their senses to investigate them. Manipulate and play with different materials.</li> <li>Use their imagination as they consider what they can do with different materials.</li> <li>Make simple models which express their ideas.</li> <li>Join different materials and explore different textures.</li> <li>Explore colour and colour-mixing.</li> </ul>
