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Academy News

You may, or may not, have given consideration to whether Thorpe Hesley Primary will enter into an Academy. Until recently, becoming an Academy was mandatory, and while the Government have relaxed this mandate, the local preference is still that Academisation provides opportunities and stability.

A letter will be coming out to parents with this newsletter. As some of us are parents ourselves we wanted to try and pre-empt your concerns, and your questions. We have picked out the top three below, and provide our views. Representatives from the Governing Board will be present at the meeting on 1 February, so we will be happy to discuss further there.

Question 1 – Will Academisation impact the success of the school and mean it is no longer outstanding, as it moves to support other schools?

Absolutely not. Part of the attraction of creating a new Academy is that we can choose like-minded schools, and the schools we will work with all have a creative curriculum at their heart. A good reading of our Ofsted report will show that planning, leadership and teaching in school is detailed, more than fit-for-purpose, and supports children's development. Academisation will bring an opportunity to share these attributes wider than just Thorpe Hesley, to benefit an increased number of children.

Question 2 – Will it mean that teachers are spread out across the schools and my child/ren will not have access to the same standard of teaching and learning?

No. Part of being outstanding means that Ofsted, and the Local Authority, are keen for us to share this best-practise, so we already run training courses across the borough and beyond. This has been in place for considerable time, and clearly the children have not suffered to date. One change since our Ofsted visit is that we are now charging for this professional development; meaning we are increasing resources to spend in school in these difficult times of government cut-backs. Ofsted commended our support staff, who are completely competent in covering classes during the short amount of time teachers are away learning, or supporting development to others. Children are likely to notice no change whatsoever.

Question 3 – What does Academisation mean for me/my child/ren?

Likely nothing. We will retain our own identity, our uniform, our processes, and the exact same leadership as now. Children or parents will not see a day-to-day change to how the school looks, acts or is run. The only change will be an increased opportunity for children to work with children from outside the school – for example we might run reading competitions, or have visits to look at an area of learning that has been particularly successful.

Mrs Toms has agreed to provide Executive Leadership to the Academy, and Kerry Hattersley (Chair of Governors) has agreed to Chair the Board of Trustees to the Academy, so Thorpe Hesley's views and preferences remain very much represented at this new level.

Hopefully this has laid your mind at ease, but the meeting on 1 February is there for those parents/carers with additional questions.
