Let's Go Wild!



Our topic

This half term we will be exploring the wonder of nature for our whole-school project 'Let's Go Wild!'. We will be focusing our learning on the work of the inspirational Sir David Attenborough and looking at how we can re-wild our school environment and surrounding community. We have lots of exciting opportunities planned, including an Art session with the natural artist, James Brunt, as well as an outdoor learning experience with our local wildlife trust.

Objectives we will cover this half term are...

Science	In Science this half term, we will be recapping and deepening our knowledge on the four seasons before learning about different species of animals. We will be looking at the classification of animals i.e. mammals, amphibians, reptiles, birds and fish as well as what they eat, where they live and how the food chain works.
Geography	In Geography, we will be looking at different weather types and comparing weather we experience in the UK to weather experienced around the world. We will also be learning about the hot and cold regions of the world and how the equator affects temperatures in different countries.
Art	In Art this half term, we will be studying sculpture and form alongside painting and colour. We will start the half term by experimenting with clay to strengthen our sculpting skills. Then, we will move on to look at how secondary colours are made using primary colours. We will be taking inspiration from the fantastic artist Ruby Keller to paint our own piece of art work.
Computing	In Computing, we will start our half term by recapping what we know about online safety. We will be looking at the importance of speaking to trusted adults when we have worries about things online. We will then be moving on to practise our coding skills using Discovery Education.
RE	In RE this half term, we will be focusing on the topic 'Who Am I?'. We will be talking about why we are all special in our own right and exploring our self-belonging. We will be using religious stories to link with our own personal experiences.
PE	In PE, we will be refining our gymnastics skills including balancing, rolling, jumping and sequencing. Once we have mastered these skills, we will be testing our gymnastic abilities using our school apparatus.
PSHE	In PSHE this half term, we will be exploring what a caring school looks like and how we can be good friends to one another. We will be using drama and discussion in lots of our lessons to help us imagine some of the scenarios we might need to face in school.
Music	This half term, we are lucky enough to have the wonderful Mr Grainger to help us with our music lessons. We will be learning the song 'Hands, Feet, Heart' and will be looking at South African music on the whole to help us understand rhythm and pulse.

Reading

This term we will be reading 'Bog Baby' by Jeanne Willis.

The Bog Baby is a magical story by Jeanne Willis and Gwen Millward.

When two small sisters go fishing to the magic pond, they find something much better than a frog or a newt. They find a bog baby. Small and blue with wings like a dragon, the girls decide to make him their secret.

We are continuing with our whole class reading rewards each half term for children who read at least 3 times per week. We will be sending reading books and home-school diaries home daily in your child's book bag to encourage regular reading at home. Your child will have the opportunity to change their reading books regularly in class but please note that it is their responsibility to do so if they have finished with a book.

Don't forget that we now offer our brand-new library service on Tuesdays and Thursdays after school down in the Infant building.

Times Tables Rockstars

Your child should now have their login for Times Tables Rockstars. Remember to encourage them to practise their times tables with a focus on their 2s, 5s and 10s. We will be setting plenty of challenges on TT Rockstars and might even go head to head against other year groups for the chance to win special prizes in school! Homework

Children will receive maths homework on a fortnightly basis. Each piece of homework will directly link to the learning they have done in class and will be tailored to meet the needs of your child. Please encourage them to work on this independently at home with minimal support, if needed.

We expect maths homework to be handed in by the date written in your child's book. If it is handed in late, your child may be expected to complete it during their break time in school.

Optional Creative Homework

To add to your child's learning experiences, we would like them to create something at home linked to our new topic, 'Let's Go Wild!'. This could be in the form of a written task, a piece of art work, a 3D model or an IT based creation such as a Powerpoint, Word document or video.

Below are a few ideas for inspiration:

- Plant some wildflower seeds in your garden to attract wildlife
- Make a bug hotel
- Make a bird box/bird feeder and fill it with seeds
- Go on a natural walk to find signs of Autumn (conkers, leaves, acorns)
- Create a fact file about British wildlife
- Get snugly and watch a nature documentary
- Build a natural den in your garden/local woodland
- Take photographs of local wildlife in your area
