Times Tables

Remember to encourage your child to practise their times tables using TT Rockstars with a focus right up to 12x12. The children should also be looking at related multiplication facts and how times tables can support with this e.g. 2x3=6, 20x3=60, 20x30=600, 2x0.3=0.6 and 0.2x0.3=0.06
