Area of learning	Objectives to be covered
Communication and Language	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use talk to help work out problems and organise thinking and activities, and to explain how things work and why they might happen. • Listen to and talk about selected non-fiction to develop a deep familiarity with new knowledge and vocabulary <p>ELG</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make comments about what they have heard and ask questions to clarify their understanding.
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	<p>ELG</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Set and work towards simple goals, being able to wait for what they want and control their immediate impulses when appropriate. • Manage their own basic hygiene and personal needs, including dressing, going to the toilet and understanding the importance of healthy food choices. • Form positive attachments to adults and friendships with peers.
Physical Development	<p>ELG</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Demonstrate strength, balance and coordination when playing. • Hold a pencil effectively in preparation for fluent writing – using the tripod grip in almost all cases.
Literacy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Re-read what they have written to check that it makes sense. <p>ELG</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Say a sound for each letter in the alphabet and at least 10 digraphs. • Write recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed.
Maths	<p>Count beyond 10</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explore the composition of numbers to 10. • Automatically recall number bonds for numbers 0-5 and some to 10.

<p>Understanding the World</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understand that some places are special to members of their community. • Recognise some environments that are different to the one in which they live. <p>The Natural World</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explore the natural world around them, making observations and drawing pictures of animals and plants. • Know some similarities and differences between the natural world around them and contrasting environments, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class. • Understand some important processes and changes in the natural world around them, including the seasons and changing states of matter.
<p>Expressive Arts and Design</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create collaboratively, sharing ideas, resources and skills. <p>ELG</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function. • Sing a range of well-known nursery rhymes and songs.
