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Free School Meals and Pupil Premium

You can claim free school meals for a child who lives with you and who you are responsible for.

Your claim will be automatically processed if you receive Housing Benefit or Council Tax Support and get any of these qualifying benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income related Employment Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit as long as you have a yearly household income of less than £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs) and do not get Working Tax Credit
- Working Tax Credit run- on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

If your child is in reception, year 1 or year 2, they are entitled to 'universal infant free school meals' regardless of your income. You do not need to apply for this.

Pupil Premium is addition funding given to schools. You child may be eligible for this if:

- They have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last six years (known as 'Ever 6 FSM)
- They have been looked after continuously for more than six months (LAC) or have previously been looked after (PostLAC)
- Are children of service personnel
- You are in receipt of benefits such as income support, income-based job seekers allowance, income related employment and support allowance, child tax credit, Universal Credit and other qualifying benefits

Currently, Pupil Premium funding is £1,455 per child (£2530 for LAC/Post LAC) which is given to school to support your child's education and fund valuable support and resources in school.

If you have already applied for Pupil Premium funding for an older sibling, this will not automatically entitle younger siblings to the funding. Therefore, it is really important you apply for each child if you feel they could be eligible for this additional support.

Disability Access Funding

Are you in receipt of Disability Living Allowance for any children who are either 3 or 4 years old? If so, please let us know via your child's class teacher or the school office as school could receive extra funding to support your child in school.
