School Gates After School

As we have now expanded our wraparound care, we are keen to be making use of our outdoor areas for these children. To ensure the site is secure for their safety, we will therefore be locking all three gates into the Junior yards at around 15:40, once all children and parents have left after school. Access will still be possible to the main junior building and outdoor classroom via the main entrance off Upper Wortley Road.

Attendance

Research shows there is evidence of a strong link between good attendance and increased attainment. Pupils who regularly attend school make much better progress both socially and academically. Our attendance policy is published on the school website. Please note that a new national framework for attendance came into force from 19th August 2024. This clearly states that holidays can only be authorised in exceptional circumstances. Any requests for a leave of absence must be made using the application which can be requested from the school office. Five or more days of unauthorised leave of absence (holiday) may result in a fixed penalty fine. A poster, produced by Rotherham Council is attached, explaining the potential implications of taking pupils out of school, in line with the new framework.

In order to encourage high attendance, we present 100% certificates each term. Also, each week the class with the highest attendance in the Junior building gets the climbing wall and football pitch to themselves at breaktimes on a Friday and the class with the highest attendance in the Infant building gets to look after Adam the Attendance Ant for the week.

Dear parents, carers and members of our school community,

You will know from news reports, and possibly from personal experience, that our country and in particular our locality have been affected by the events triggered from the shocking murders in Southport last month. The murders sparked a wave of disinformation across social media, leading to racist riots in many areas including Rotherham.

As part of this, people of colour and police were attacked. Mosques, immigration centres and a hotel in Manvers were attacked and, sadly many people felt it was not safe for themselves or their families to go out in public.

Many people have been convicted, including several children. Convictions have been for people looting shops, damaging property, spreading online misinformation and inciting the violence. There have since been several significant custodial sentences.

This small minority of people across the country have taken part in activities and expressed views that go against our beliefs at NCLT primary schools. Their views that people from other backgrounds and other ethnicities do not deserve the same rights in our country are against everything we stand for and teach our pupils in our schools. We have many children and families who are from different backgrounds. Some may speak different languages; some may have lived in other countries; some may have parents or grandparents who have lived in different countries. Some may have different coloured skin, and some may have different religions and beliefs. BUT we are all equal and everyone is valued!!

Our schools are very proud of our communities, both within school and the wider area. It is really important that we continue to show support to our whole school community and every person within it. We will continue to show that we will not tolerate those views in our school and work with you, our families, as well as with our pupils to ensure that tolerance, understanding and having an open mind to all cultures is our way.
