

### **SUDS Planters**

We are now the proud owners of three beautiful SUDS Planters, gifted to the school by Yorkshire Water. SUDS means sustainable urban drainage and the planters are all about trying to slow the flow of rainwater into the sewers to help reduce the possibility of flooding within the community. Our three planters are located outside the year 3 and 4 door, in reception playground and in the nursery playground. They have been planted up with plants which will look stunning in no time at all. The nursery children are especially excited about their new ferns and will be even more intrigued next week when a new display will be added to their planter.

Some of the plants look tiny or brown at the moment as they are in their winter form but we can assure you they are very much alive and ask if you can help us make sure they are looked after, especially before and after school please.
