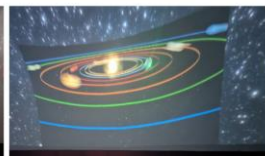

## THORPE HESLEY PRIMARY SCHOOL– COLOUR RUN

We will be holding our exciting annual 'Colour Run' event on Friday 20th June 2025 and we would like to invite our children and families to take part. The event will help to raise funds for our school. Colour runners will run around a track on the school field whilst being covered in powder paints. Please note the powders are natural, non-toxic and easy to clean!

Children participating in the run can be collected from their classrooms at either 2.30pm or at normal home time by a responsible adult. To stagger the run we will have 2 start times, one at 2.45pm for those being collected early and another at 3.30pm for those being collected at normal home time. Children not taking part will stay in class and complete activities until they are collected at the usual time. Please note only children taking part will be permitted to leave early for safeguarding purposes. Any children attending after school club can still participate and will run with a member of staff.

All children taking part will be required to attend school on the day of the event in old clothes and preferably a white t-shirt.

Entry is priced at £5.00 per person. If you and your child would like to take part, please log onto Arbor and make the payment for the required number of tickets via the new 'Arbor Shop' function. Please note that physical tickets will not be handed out, but we will keep a record of your child's name and the number of tickets purchased.

As Father's Day is on the weekend prior to this event, we would like encourage as many dads, grandads, uncles etc as possible to take part! Come along and join us for some fabulous rainbow fun!!



## Golfing News

We just wanted to share with you some exciting news about one of our students.

We're very proud to say that Annabelle performed in the European Golf Championships last week; a huge accomplishment and a testament to her commitment and effort to the sport. Annabelle played some of her best golf and even managed to set a new PB.

This is Annabelle's fifth year playing golf, and in 2023 alone she competed in 33 tournament events. Thanks to the scores she achieved in several of those competitions, she reached Level 4 Priority Status with U.S. Kids Golf, which earned her invitations to international events.

Last year, she competed in tournaments in Ireland and Germany and this year began with the Turkish Open, where she moved up an age category, increasing both the course length and her rounds to 18 holes. She also proudly finished runner-up in the Parent/Child Tournament at that event.

These international events have given Annabelle the chance to challenge herself against some of the best junior golfers in the world, helping her grow and improve through the experience. She's already excited about her upcoming event in Paris this July and is looking into a tournament in Dubai this December as well.

Looking further ahead, Annabelle is aiming to qualify for the World Championships at Pinehurst in 2026. With her determination and continued hard work, we believe it's a goal she can achieve.

Needless to say, we are all very proud of Annabelle and can't wait to see what else she can achieve!
