## Supporting a calm start to the school day in KS1

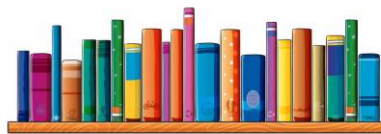
As we settle into the school year, we'd like to kindly ask for your support in helping our mornings run as smoothly as possible.

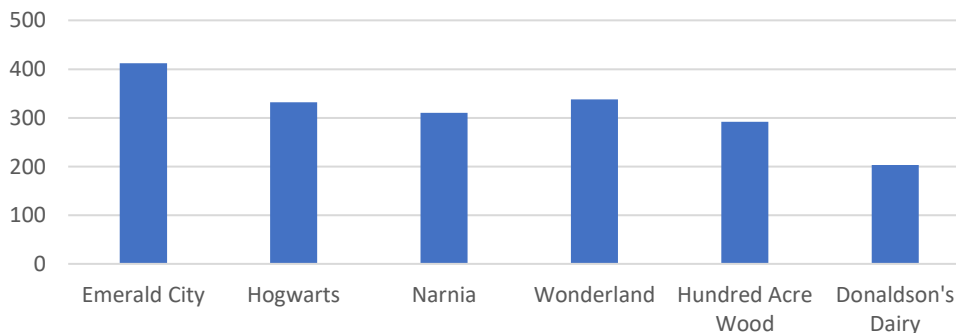
