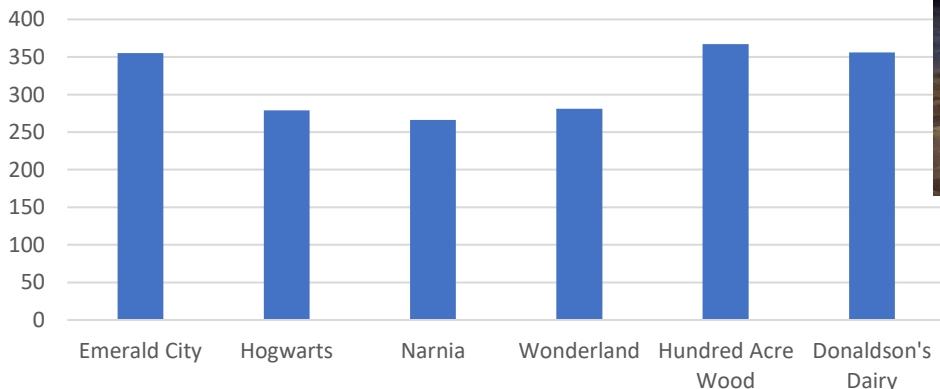
It has been wonderful to see so much engagement and excitement in classrooms this week. Well done to all our pupils for their hard work and enthusiasm!



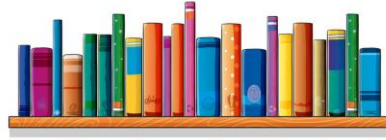
